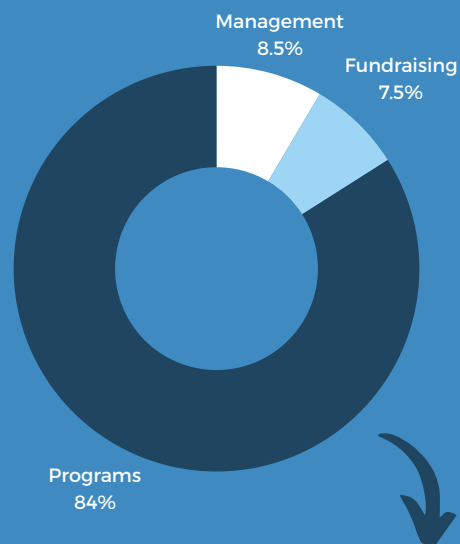

JANUARY

Real Life Real Impact (RLRI) events help participants discover purpose in their work, connect with peers, and explore opportunities to serve using their veterinary skills.

The Training of Trainers (TOT) is one example of the many training opportunities offered throughout the year. CVM helps equip veterinary professionals and their families with skills and essential techniques that help them prepare for effective work in cross-cultural settings.

The first new Long-Term Field Worker of the year, Lenore Thorne, LVT was sent to Mongolia joining the V.E.T. Net team. After her, 4 additional Field Workers were sent to Asia.

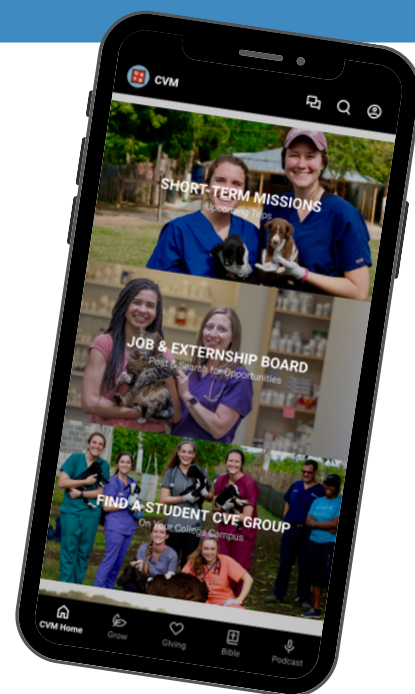
