This led to compassion fatigue and burnout in 6 years. This forced me to retire from practicing medicine in 2020. My next phase of life led me to provide lectures to VBMA's at 21 different veterinary colleges nationwide. I have also provided lectures at the Midwest Vet Conference, KC FETCH Conference, and several Real-Life Real Impact conferences. In 2023, I became an Assistant Professor and Clinical Relations Veterinarian at Lincoln Memorial University College of Veterinary Medicine.
