Practical Debt Management with Biblical Wisdom presentation equips veterinary students and professionals to approach debt with clarity, stewardship, and faith. The session explores types of debt, interest rates, and repayment strategies, framed by biblical principles like budgeting, self-discipline, and contentment. Attendees learn to create zero-based budgets, ways to avoid lifestyle inflation, and how to build emergency savings. Practical tools and apps are introduced alongside spiritual encouragement to trust God as Provider. Attendees are reminded that gratitude shifts perspective from scarcity to stewardship and will leave with renewed confidence and a biblical framework for managing debt with wisdom, gratitude, purpose, and peace.

“Putting Faith Over Fear” - Caleta Willis, MS

What do you do when God is calling you to step out of your comfort zone and put your faith in His plan for you?
